Other issues of concern: Trail/ pond issues

Trying to get wood chips - need a new, good source for wood chips on the trails

Invasive control done this year. Burns done, sowing of seeds done. Put in Michigan Lilies – attract butterflies and other species. Water smart weed – good food for waterfowl.

Jim requesting pictures of crowds from goats at the pond. Working on an article for Wild Ones about goat experience.
